WHAT IS THE UNIVERSITY CODES OF CONDUCT?

Tuskegee University is a private educationatitution that has a vested interest in maintaining community standar, deducating students abouter behavior, and providing a safe and educationally sound environment for all community members. The University Codes of Conduct are the rules and processe in place by Tuskegee University to achieve these goals.

WHAT ARE THE MAJOR DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY CODES OF CONDUCT AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEMS?

The University Codes of Conduct is focdsom educating the student with emphasis on student development and accountability, while gloal of the criminal justice system is primarily focused on punishment and rehabilita. Therefore, the University works with students who have been accused of violathe rules and regulations of Tuskegee University (found primarily in the Stude Handbook under the Codes of Conduct) and finding a meaningful resolution of those accusations.

WHY DOES TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY GETNVOLVED WITH MY BEHAVIOR OFF CAMPUS?

As a Tuskegee University Student, certailes used regulations apply to your behavior. Tuskegee has stated that, "Jurisdiction of Thuskegee University Codes of Conduct shall not be limited to conduct that occurs on Tuskedges versity premises. It will be applicable to any conduct which affects the Tuskegee University community as a whole, its individual members, or the pursuit of idsjectives." In other words, our behavior reflects on your Alma Mater, therefore the University withsider taking internal action when that behavior reflects on Tuskegee in a negative manner.

WHY IS THE UNIVERSITY CHARGING ME WITH A POLICY VIOLATION IF I AM GOING THROUGH THE LOCAL/STATE/FEDER& COURTS? ISN'T THAT DOUBLE JEOPARDY?

Students may be accountable to both civil **atitles** and to the University for acts that violate local, state, or federlaws. (Students are encouragedseek advice of legal counsel when they face criminal charges.) Distripry action through University processes concurrent with criminal actin does not subject a student double jeopardy" as this is a legal term referring to criminal court action Suskegee University is not a state or federal agency and operates under completely diffepelicies, procedures, and standards to ensure compliance with community standards.

I HAVE BEEN "WRITTEN UP" BY A TUPD OFFCER; OR I HAVE BEEN CITED BY THE POLICE IN REGARDS TO MY BEHAVOR, WHO DO I HAVE TO MEET WITH?

When a report of an alleged violationt be Tuskegee University Code of Conduct is reported to the Office of the Dean of Studented Judicial Affairs the case is assigned to a member of the staff for resolution. You will betified via our secure electronic system of the accusations and how to schedule a meetiting the Judicial Affairs Officer for your case. You should contact the Juial Affairs Officer or the Office of the Dean of Students and Judicial Affairs immediately upon receipt of the embailmake an appointment. Failure to do so may limit your option is resolving the case

At that initial meeting, a student may, at **the**cretion of the Judicial Affairs Officer be given an opportunity to resolve the char**b**staking responsibility fothe charges, if a student does this, sanctions will be assigned by the Judicial Affairs Officer and the matter will be concluded.

If a student does not accept responsibility for charges, or is ngtven an opportunity to do so, the case will be resolved via a discipry conference or a disciplinary hearing. A disciplinary conference is an informal process which a Judicial Affairs Officer reviews the evidence in question, talks with the acclustedent (and in some cases witnesses), and makes a decision as to both the student's respibity and if applicable, sanctions that are to be imposed. A disciplinary hearing is a fairprocess before the niversity Judicial Hearing Board in which a panel reviews allevent information and makes a determination regarding responsibility and sanctions

hearing to represent the student. Howeivecases where there are pending criminal charges, the accused student may have legandsel present as an advisor. If the case involves sexual misconduct, either party nhave an advisor of their choosing, which could be an attorney. If present he counsel may not participe in the hearing in any way except in advising the accesed student. In these cases, th

hours (five days) of receiving the appeal from the Vice President of Student Affairs and Enrollment Management. The form should be typewritten, with a trached statement of no more than five double-spaced pages in length. The statement of clearly specify the grounds which the appeal request is being submitted and it must be accompanied by any are supporting documentation. Each case may be appealed only once.

Upon receipt of the Appeal of Disciplinary Action form and all supporting documentation, the Judicial

- x <u>Disciplinary Deferred Suspension</u>. The stanc of disciplinary suspension may be placed in deferred status for a limited period dime. During this period of time, any further violations of the Code of Conduweill result in an immediate suspension. Additionally it means that the student is pretrmitted to represent the University in any official way off campus(i.e. athletics, musical performance groups, etc.)
- x <u>Disciplinary Suspension</u>. Disciplinary suspision is the temporary separation of the student from the Tuskegee University Community.
- x Expulsion. Expulsion is the permanent removia student from the university.

Other sanctions may be imposed in an efforturb behavior, deucate the student, and protect the community. Additional information can be found in Student Handbook; specifically, the Codes of Conduct.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'TCOMPLETE MY SANCTIONS?

Any student who fails to content his or her sanctions case charged with additional violations of the Student Cosleef Conduct. Additionally, yousanctions can be increased, which may lead to suspension or expulsion.

WHAT IF I AM UNABLE TO COMPLETE MY SANCTIONS BY THE DEADLINE GIVEN? The Tuskegee University Community is conspect of reasonable people making reasonable decisions. If there are circumstances that ince an extension on your deadline contact the Office of the Dean of Students and Judicial Ars prior to the datgour sanctions are due to explain your situation and request an extension. Extensions will be given on a case by case basis.

IF I AM FOUND RESPONSIBLE FOR A VIOLATION OF THE TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT, WILL MY PARENTS BE INFORMED? Your disciplinary records amerotected by the Family Edutional Rights and Privacy Act Employers

Most employers do not requirereview of your conduct recorduit others especially those involving security clearances maygain it is in a student's beissiterest to be honest about conduct violations when asked.

Can a student's disciplinary record be expunged?

No, Tuskegee does not expunge or wipe clean student disciplinary records.

I AM A STUDENT ATHLETE, ISMY COACH GOING TO FND OUT THAT I VIOLATED THE CODE OF CONDUCT?

IF I AM FOUND RESPONSIBLE, WILL ITAFFECT MY FINANCIAL AID?

IF I AM FOUND RESPONSIBLE OF A VIOLATION OF THE STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT BUT THE POLICEWERE NOT INVOLVED, WILL THE POLICE BE NOTIFIED TO CITE ME FOR VOLATIONS OF THE LAW?

Possibly. Because the university has an isteireinappropriate behavior separate from that of the civil authorities, it has the right daresponsibility to exersive its jurisdiction and take such action as is appriate to protect this interest. When the university has
